Year 1 have been learning about birds in their science lesson. They have been learning the differences between birds and mammals and finding similarities and differences between species.











Robert was responsible for the planning, funding and operation of the state-of-the-art third generation artificial grass pitch at Needham Market Football Club, raising over £850,000 in funding and winning the 2018 national Buildbase Club Renovation Programme with a prize of £50,000 product bursary.
