Year 7 Geographers have been acting out their news report of a volcanic eruption.






Tennis Fixtures

Last weekend was the Music competition and students from lpswich High School were placed in every class they entered.



In the Piano classes Archie gained two 2nd places and Eleanor was placed 3rd in her class.

The youngest competitor was Cecilia, from the Prep School, who was awarded the Young Vocalist Championship. Other outstanding performances were given by Evie, who was awarded 3rd place in the Vocalist 16-20 class and Maria, who won the class. Both girls gained Distinctions in this category, demonstrating an extremely high standard of vocal expertise. Maria also won the Senior Vocalist Championship.

In the instrumental categories Leo was placed second for his expressive playing of Elgar and Squires. Sofia and Madeleine won the Duet category and the adjudicator commented on how much they appeared to enjoy playing together. The final class of the day, after eleven hours of music, was won by Madeleine, whose performance of Elgar's cello concerto was outstanding.

Gemma is a senior police staff leader with significant experience in the analysis, business planning, strategy and change arenas. Gemma's policing career started when she joined Cambridgeshire Constabulary in 2000, Over the next eight years she developed her expertise in analysis through accomplishments including working as the lead analyst on Operation Fincham.

Gemma joined Norfolk and Suffolk Constabularies in 2012 forming and leading the Joint Performance and Analysis Department and subsequently integrating this with the Corporate Change department. Having passed the Senior Police National Assessment Centre (PNAC), Gemma completed the Strategic Command Course (SCC) in 2020.

In April 2020 Gemma was seconded to NPCC and Operation Talla [the national policing response to COVID-19] to lead the national recovery, reform and organisational learning programme. In June 2021, Gemma was appointed as the Head of the NPCC Strategic like.

Marine Biology



This informative talk is for all senior pupils (Y7-13) interested in - Biology : Geography : Marine Life : Conservation : Geology : Oceanography : Chemistry : Paleontology : Diving : PE : Zoology

Michael Steinke lectures at the Department of Biological Sciences, University of Essex.

Michael states: "I research addresses fundamental questions on the role of biogenic volatile organic compounds (BVOCs) in the physiology and ecology of aquatic organisms. Many of the BVOCs I study transfer into the atmosphere where they affect the climate. I develop sensor technologies to aid the monitoring of bivalve (oyster) behaviour.

My group is currently developing novel tools to support our work to monitor environments for cysters.'

Come to this talk to learn more about a Marine Biologist's job role, where they work, how you get into this line of work, the promotional opportunities available and much more!

Marine biologists study life within the world's seas and oceans, conducting research in both the water and in the laboratory to analyse how plants and animals are affected by changes in the environment, some of which are caused by human activities. They often specialize in studying one species of animal or plan, and may travel the world to study its habitals and feeding patterns.
